Together, we are advancing climate resilience across coastal and land-based systems, driving regional prosperity, and unlocking local economic opportunities through sustainable climate solutions.



About the Climate Summit

The Climate Summit will kick off on the morning of May 29 with a curated 10 Tables Exercise bringing together community leaders, organizations, municipal staff, and residents to identify practical solutions to climate challenges facing Pictou County. The 10 themes include:

1. Clean Energy and Mobility
2. Green Jobs and Innovation
3. Watersheds and Natural Assets
4. Biodiversity and Recreation
5. Waste and Materials Management
6. Local Food and Circular Economy
7. Climate Adaptation and Emergency Readiness
8. Health and Community Resilience
9. Housing and Affordability
10. Belonging and Inclusion

In the evening, the Climate Social offers a relaxed opportunity for municipal leaders and staff, organizations, businesses, community members, and exhibitors to connect and engage with others in the climate ecosystem.

On May 30, the Climate Summit takes center stage, featuring a full day of speakers, panel discussions, interactive activities, and more. Exhibitor Fees


- Grassroots Organizations (2 or fewer staff): \$350.00 (Includes up to 2 representatives)
- Non-Profits/Charitable Organizations (3 or more staff): \$450.00 (Includes up to 2 representatives)
- Businesses & Educational Institutions: \$550.00 (Includes up to 2 representatives)
- Additional Representatives On-Site: \$75.00 / person

What's Included

- One 8-foot display table
- 2 chairs
- Additional space behind the table for a pop-up banner or small supplementary display
- Lunch provided for exhibitors on both days of the Summit
- Listed in the Summit exhibitor directory
 - Electrical access available upon request for audiovisual needs, demonstrations, or device charging (spots are limited and assigned on a first-come, first-served basis)
